The Tasmanian Government is committed to maximising opportunities for local SME¹ businesses to compete for and win Government procurements. Suppliers/proponents are requested to prepare a Tasmanian Industry Participation Plan:

- For all procurements with a value exceeding \$5 million;
- For nominated procurements (at the discretion of the procuring Government entity) greater than \$2 million and up to \$5 million; and
- For private sector projects valued at over \$5 million that receive support, including in-kind support, valued at or greater than \$500 000 from the Government.

For procurements, the Tasmanian Industry Participation Plan is an essential part of your submission and will be used by the procuring entity to evaluate your submission. In these circumstances, the Plan will contribute a minimum of 10% of the procurement evaluation. Suppliers that fail to submit a Plan will receive a zero score in relation to this criterion.

Biotronik currently employs one staff member in Tasmania (TAS) providing clinical support for this product group. In the case of a contract award leading to significantly higher business levels than before, Biotronik would plan to employ an additional staff for clinical support of these products. This staff member would preferentially be recruited in TAS. However, as the clinical procedures require highly skilled experts with very specific background and experience, it may be possible that a proportion of the new employment positions are to be filled with candidates outside TAS, but within Australia, and relocated to TAS.

Opportunity for local SME involvement

Other than manufacturing, all other services are already provided within TAS / Australia or sourced from other Australian / TAS suppliers (distribution, marketing, clinical support, training, education, research).

Regular monthly visits from other support and management staff from Head Office (Sydney) and management staff with overnight stays supporting local hotels, restaurant, transport industry, hire cars, etc. Ongoing education activities for clinical staff includes catering, function room hire, multimedia equipment hire etc.
