The Tasmanian Government is committed to maximising opportunities for local suppliers to compete for and win Government procurements. Suppliers/proponents are requested to prepare a Tasmanian Industry Participation Plan (TIPP):

- for all procurements with a value exceeding \$5 million;
- for nominated procurements (at the discretion of the procuring Government entity) greater than \$2 million and up to (and including) \$5 million; and
- for private sector projects valued at over \$5 million that receive support, including in-kind support, valued at or greater than \$500 000 from the Government.

The Tamar Estuary River Health Action Plan (TE RHAP) – Combined System Improvements will be delivered by TasWater and managed by the Capital Delivery Office (TW CDO) on their behalf. The project is funded by the Australian Government, Tasmanian Government, City of Launceston and TasWater.

The TW CDO Alliance partners have company-wide policies to encourage and ensure local participation at an Australian, State and Regional level. These policies aim to provide equity in access to locally based businesses and workers, with an acknowledgement of the specific place of Indigenous Australians in this planning. This program will be undertaken in accord with these policies.

Tasmania has a diverse workforce distributed across the island state with a strong pool of SME businesses capable of delivering various packages of works for TW. The existing business capacity and skill level of the local area is strong in terms of ability to perform the works. The proposed TW approach highlights the expectation that it will be actively involved in supporting SME's and their businesses wherever possible.

Where are the goods or services to be used in the contract sourced from?

Local SMEs will be engaged where practical. The extent of work is yet to be confirmed.

The TW CDO focus is to encourage and support local business where ever possible, this commitment flows through this program to the Alliance Supply Chain.

Within this commitment, the TW CDO Program Management Alliance will:

- Purchase from Tasmanian based businesses where possible and appropriate;
- Provide full, fair and reasonable opportunity for Tasmanian based businesses where they are competitive on price, performance, quality, suitability and delivery;
- Structure specifications, tenders and other program documentation to provide local business the opportunity for maximum participation in the supply of goods and services;
- Establish protocols for contact and advice for these businesses to ensure they are aware of all opportunities.

Opportunity for Tasmanian SME* involvement

It is proposed to engage with the Tasmanian based market in the early stages of the project to confirm capability and availability of local suppliers.

Various works packages will be tendered to the market inclusive of local suppliers.

Tasmanian based businesses are actively encouraged to seek involvement with this project but must do so on the basis of remaining competitive with their terms of business, price, quality, delivery, service, safety, environmental requirements and relevant experience.

Procurement planning will identify strategies to enable local suppliers to participate in packages released to the market.

Broader social and economic opportunities

The implementation of this project is expected to enhance the skills and experience of the local market through their involvement and exposure to the delivery of key works briefings and components.

An Indigenous employment target of 3 per cent and an Indigenous supplier-use target of 3 per cent will be established for the project, and that priority in meeting the targets is given to local Indigenous businesses, organisations and potential employees.


