Are you a Tasmanian SME*? Do you employ Tasmanians?

Medirecruit is not a Tasmanian SME. Broader social and economic opportunities

The introduction of the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) and the aging population in Australia has resulted in increased demand for allied health services. This in turn has led to a shortage of allied health professionals such as occupational therapists, speech pathologists, physiotherapists, podiatrists, radiologists, and others Australia-wide. The shortage of allied health professionals has resulted in limited or unavailable services and longer waiting times resulting in increased health problems, decreased productivity, and economic burden on individuals, families, and communities.

Medirecruit will have a significant impact on Tasmania both socially and economically by successfully recruiting allied health professionals to restore, maintain and boost allied health services. By doing so, Medirecruit will increase access to essential healthcare services and help improve the health and wellbeing of Tasmanian communities. Moreover, by reducing the burden on the health system and improving the productivity of individuals, families, and communities, Medirecruit will contribute to the economic growth and development of Tasmania.

Given the extent of the current shortages of allied health professionals in Australia, Medirecruit will recruit allied health professionals to jobs in Tasmania from other parts of Australia and overseas such as the UK. These professionals will have a positive impact on the Tasmanian economy through things such as renting, shopping, using local service and holidaying and exploring Tasmania. For our younger health professionals, those very active on social media, working and

traveling in Tasmania provides a great opportunity for them to promote the beautiful sites of Tassie and attract other travellers to visit the Apple Isle.
