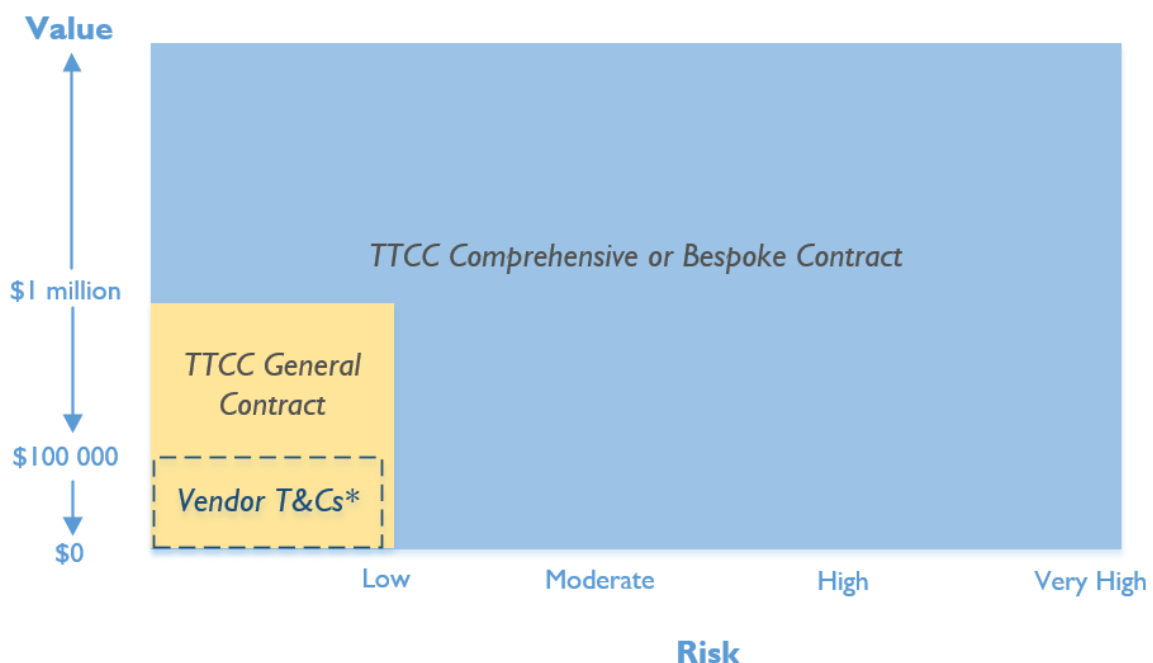

### THE TASMANIAN TECHNOLOGY CONTRACT CONDITIONS

The Tasmanian Technology Contract Conditions (TTCC) framework includes four contract types. The contract types allow for a range of information technology procurements, of different value and risk.

The contract types are:

- General Contract
- Vendor Terms and Conditions (Vendor T&Cs)
- Comprehensive Contract
- Bespoke Contract



\* For procurements that are low risk and valued at less than \$100 000, agencies can consider Vendor T&Cs in accordance with the Treasurer's Instructions (TI PP-3) and the *Guidelines for Using Vendor Terms and Conditions*.

### Deciding which contract to use

There are a number of factors that may impact which TTCC contract type you should use. The [TTCC Decision Tool](#) is available to assist in your decision making. This is a guidance tool only. Seek advice from your agency procurement team or the OCS if you are unsure which contract is appropriate for your procurement. The [ICT Risk Matrix](#) can be used to help determine the risk level of a procurement.

# The TTCC vs the GITC

## Risk and liability

The Tasmanian Government has made a commitment to adopting a risk based approach to limiting liability in ICT contracts. Liability caps should be determined on a contract by contract basis, depending on the risk profile of the transaction.

The [TTCC Toolkit](#), in particular the TTCC Framework User Guide, provides guidance on liability cap options and assessing risk.

## The TTCC vs the GITC

The key differences between the TTCC and the GITC are:

- Four contract options (instead of one).
- No head agreement or contract authority with Treasury.
- New terminology (see below).
- Different Modules (including cloud) and Schedules (see below).
- User Guide and Guidance Notes available.
- More modern and user friendly.

## Changes to terminology

Below is a summary of the key changes to terminology in the TTCC framework.

## TTCC and GITC modules

There are seven modules available for use with a Comprehensive Contract. The modules address particular transaction types. Only the relevant module should be attached to the Comprehensive Contract.
