The products offered in Amgen's submission are sourced from overseas due to the complexity of biopharmaceutical manufacturing requirements and the critical volume necessary for viable business practice. However, the warehousing, handling, primary distribution, customer service and customs clearing requirements are handled locally.

Amgen's capabilities that will support the submission for the Pharmaceutical Products tender and dispensing of products for the therapy to treat Tasmania patients will include

- 1. Logistics Support Amgen utilises the cold chain logistics and customer service expertise of a third party logistics provider. This partnership has maintained quality inventory management, storage and distribution. Amgen products are available through the wholesaling and distribution services of Symbion Hospital Services and Clifford Hallam Healthcare that provide distribution of Amgen products at a local level to hospitals with warehouses across Australia including Melbourne which service the Hospitals Tasmania.
- 2. Strategic Account Manager (SAM) based in Melbourne office will be a primary local contact for both Department of Health and Human Services Tasmania (DHHS) and Hospital Pharmacy and procurement staff within the jurisdiction of DHHS's remit.
- 3. Contracts & Pricing Senior Associate based in Sydney head office will create and deliver our submission plus provide required activity reporting on a regular basis. In addition this resource will provide contact liaison with DHHS throughout the timeframe of the contract.
- 4. Medical Information Service The Medical Information Service is a 24-hour facility available to Healthcare physicians, pharmacists, nurses and other health care professionals for access to the latest literature and information on current research on Amgen's products.
- 5. Patient Support packs will be provided on demand by Hospital centres.

Research & Development in Australia

Amgen has been conducting business in Australia since the launch of Neupogen® (filgrastim) in 1991. Through the ongoing introduction of new medicines, the company has helped thousands of patients in Australia and New Zealand in their fight against serious illness. Approximately one third of Amgen Australia's workforce is involved in clinical trial work.

An Interdisciplinary Approach to Research and Development

Over the past 30 years, Amgen has been a leading innovator in the identification, isolation, production and use of human proteins as therapeutic agents. Today, Amgen scientists work at the cutting edge between the traditional disciplines of chemistry and cellular and molecular biology, in an effort to discover and develop the medical breakthroughs of tomorrow. Amgen focuses on pioneering treatments for serious illness. As part of that commitment, Amgen's R&D organisation has cultivated expertise in multiple treatment modalities (large-molecule proteins, small molecules and antibodies) allowing us to choose the best target for attacking disease and to use the modality most likely to affect that target.

Clinical Trials

While Amgen established offices in Australia in 1991, clinical research in the region actually started much earlier. In 1987, phase 1 clinical trial work for Neupogen® was carried out in Royal Melbourne Hospital. In 2016, we conducted 40 studies across 230 sites across Australia and New Zealand, involving over 1,000 patients trailing Amgen's innovative medicines including a proportionate number in the State of Victoria. Much of the current research focuses on advancements in haematology and oncology and leverages Australia's high quality medical researchers and infrastructure to help bring new therapies from the laboratory to the marketplace.

In service education

Amgen heavily supports the education activities of Health Care Professionals by providing In-service presentations and training from an Amgen Representatives to Health Care Professionals including physicians, nurses, pharmacists and allied health staff.
