

## Routine Disclosure of Overall Government Procurement Statistics

The Department of Treasury and Finance receives information on a quarterly basis regarding the participation of Tasmanian businesses in Government procurements. Data is received from entities required to comply with the Treasurer's Instructions.<sup>1</sup>

Below is a snapshot of the current financial year's procurement statistics. Open procurements include Request for Tender (RFT), Request for Proposal (RFP) and Expressions of Interest (EOI) processes. Selective procurements include Request for Quotation (RFQ) processes.
